

Ignatian Spirituality

St Ignatius of Loyola

- this spirituality uses prayer with scripture as a foundation
- people use Lectio Divina to draw conclusions from scripture
- read, pray, contemplate, reflect.
- you are "projected" into the Biblical scene as a character
- the path of asceticism the Cross
- Myers Briggs = SJ Sensing/Judging
- meditation (individual here or in church)
- GRACE: Realize more deeply God's mercy for me.(20 minutes)

Augustinian Spirituality

St. Augustine of Hippo

- this spirituality uses creative imagination to transpose the world of scripture to our situation today
- Romans 13:13-14
- ¹³let us live honourably as in the day, not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. ¹⁴Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.
- the path of devotion
- Myers Briggs = NF Intuitive/Feeling

Franciscan Spirituality

St. Francis of Assisi

- this spirituality leads to loving service
- people are moved by the Holy Spirit
- the incarnation and life events of Jesus are central.
- people have a strong attachment to God's creation
- the path of service
- Myers Briggs = SP Sensing/Percieving
- meditation (in church) with Prayer of St. Francis (20 minutes)
- "What will I do?" (in myself, my community, the world)
- Feedback
